The 487-page book includes 57 Buchanan County cemeteries, 28 borderline cemeteries, maps, 1850 & 1852 Census, Early marriages from 1848-1869, short history of early settlers, list of Civil War veterans of the county, current deaths from 1975-1979, photos of stones and a section of epitaphs. -BR

Information from the Iowa State Historical Department The library is open to the public from 8:00-4:00 Monday-Friday. You may subscribe to ANNALS OF LOWA, the Quarterly of Iowa History. for \$2.00. Back issues are available for purchase at \$1.00 per copy.

In the Census Room you can use the following census: 1835 - Dubuque and Des Moines Courty, 1840 - Glayton, Clinton, Cedar, Dubuque, Des Moines, Delaware, Herry, Johnson, Jefferson, Jackson, Jones, Linn, Lee, Louisa, Muscatine, Scott, VanBuren, and Washington. 1850, 56, 60, 70, 80, 85, 95, 1900, 1905, 1915, and 1985. Also Indian Census for Sac and Fox Tribes.

The staff will report on one family per census year for \$3.00 if you wish to search by mail. Send county, township (if knows) and

name of family.

The Historical Library contains over 62,000 volumes of historical and genealogical records. This includes a large section on Iowa Military Records.

The newspaper library contains a permanent collection of 15,000 microfilm robls of newspapers, 15,000 bound volumes of newspapers, and local court house and genealogical records of some Iowa counties USE YOUR STATE HISTORICAL MUSEUM AND ARCHIVES.

UPDATE ON THE NEW HISTORICAL BUILDING DEBATE.

The Capitol Planning Commission has voted to limit the new building to a Museum only. This would exclude the library, census room, newspaper library, and other archives. the knew present a strong argument that it is essential to provide a building with temperature and humidity controls to protect and preserve the state's irreplaceable archival records. legislators, the newspaper, the Governor, and the Capitol Planning Commission to voice your concern. Spread the word to other organizations and service groups. The Historical Building belongs to the people of Iowa and should be a place where Iowans can learn, research and enjoy their heritage.
