The above twenty-one men represents the number who were naturalized in the ten year period 1862-1871. They are all men because women of the family of a naturalized man automatically became a citizen of the United States. Many of our ancestors stopped long enough in Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, etc for several years before moving westward into Iowa. My own great-grandfather from Scotland was naturalized at New Lisbon, Columbiana County, Ohio. If your ancestor naturalization file isn'trecorded in Warren County, then check in

the county seat of the state where he resided.
