DID YOU KNOW that from 1 September, 1864 to 1 August 1866 a tax stamp was required on the back of a photographic print. That bit of know-ledge could help you date an old picture pretty closely.

OBITUARY IDEA from the Key City Genealogical Society Newsletter, March 1982: "The revised method of handling obits from the Dubuque Telegraph-Herald went into effect 1 Jan 1981. No longer do the members cut, clip, sort, paste and accumulate! The process was streamlined into one operation. A loose-leaf book, with alphabetical pages is passed to a different person each month. That person records each day's obits on the proper page, with date, name, page and column. On December 31, 1981, the pages were "bound" and placed in our archives - a ready, alphabetical index for all of the obits published during the year."
