IS SALT LAKE CITY IN YOUR FUTURE PLANS? From the Jan-Feb National Genealogical Society Newsletter we find this news: "The 1910 Federal population census schedules and related indexes will be available to Library patrons early in 1983 after the microfilms have been processed and catalogued. The census consists of 1,784 microfilm rolls, and the indexes to twenty-one states are contained on 4,642 rolls (Soundex-Miracode system).

Construction of the Genealogical Library's new 136,000-squarefoot building on the block west of Temple Square in Salt Lake City will begin in January 1983. It will replace the present facility located in the 28 story LDS Church office building. The new library will have five floors initially and sufficient structural capacity to

accommodate three more when needed.

A 6,000-square-foot underground storage facility adjacent to the new building will accommodate high density storage. The new library will have classrooms on each floor and space to seat approximately 960 patrons. Library patrons will have access to computer terminals, books, microfilm, microfische, and other research sources.

Estimated completion of the new facility is early 1985.

- 2 Mary Miller died 14 April 1897, age 62y 10 m 3d. Birthdate? 14 4 1897 3 10 62 11 6 1834 or 11 June 1834.
- 3 in 1842, Jame was 50 years old & couldn't have had 9 children. A youngest son had to be born from 9 to 20 years after date of marriage, so wouldn't be old enough to marry in 1955.

- 1 Which Federal census was the first to list all members of a household?
- William Lee is first shown on a census with his parents in 1870, age 3, born IN. The 1900 census for IA shows a Wm. Lee, age 40, b. IN, married for 20 years. Could this be the same William Lee?

  An obituary for Sally Morris tells us that she died 17 Jan 1918,
- age 80 years, at Storm Lake, IA. She was born in KY & moved to IN at age 5, then to IL at age 13. She married first in IA in 1860 to James Simpson, and a 2nd time in 1881 to Albert Johnson. Where would you find census and marriage records for Sally & her parents?
