The National Archives and Record Service is resuming the census microfilm program, which had been suspended for 19 months. You may order microfilm through the public library or through genealogical associations by writing to: Census Microfilm Rental Program P.O. Box 2940, Hyattsville, Maryland 20784.

You can not order as an individual. The basic 7-day charge is \$2.25. If the film is returned more than 2 days late you are assessed an additional \$2.25. The 1790 to 1900 Census and Soundex will be available. Later on the 1910 will be ready.

Many wouthern records were deposited North of the Mason-Dixon line and some are even located in Americana, Brazil.
