MARCH 20, 1987 The WCGS will tour the LDS Branch Library in West Des Moines with Hailey. The following is taken from the Feb.87 Eastern NE Gen. Soc. newsletter, (who took from the Dec. 18, 1986 Los Angeles Times) POSTPONE EUROPE: BEGIN at the LIBRARY If you are serious about researching your family tree, become familiar with the LDS Branch Genealogical Library near you. There are approximately 650 of them, located in every state and throughout world. These libraries have two basic kinds of records: previous research and original documents. All branch libraries will have the following collections--all excellstarting places for each surname on your chart.

IGI- International Cenealogical Index- is a microfiche listing more than 100 million names. It is arranged by state (in the United States) and by county and country for the rest of the world. CARD CATALOGUE- Available on microfiche and microfilm. It should be consulted for surnames you are interested in and by locality to obtain the numbers of records microfilmed for areas you want.

ORIGIN of the TERM, "FAMILY TREE"

It is believed by some authorities on the subject that the idea of a family tree had its origin from the efforts of artists in the Middle Ages to depict the prophecy of the verse in Isaiah 11;1 that states "There shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse..." He was a patriarch of the tribe of Judah and father of David. A typical example showed a tree growing from the chest of a reclining Jesse with each branch ending with one of his descendants who became a king, thus giving rise to the term "family tree" as a synonym for genealogy. You then can order film from Salt Lake City's main library.

FAMILY REGISTRY- A microfiche listing of names other genealogists are currently working on. You may register your names as well.

AIS SEARCHES- This large microfiche collection is a printout of accelerated Indexing Systems' (AIS) data base that was used to print its main census indexes. It is arranged by search area (grouping census records of certain regions

On your first visit to a branch library, ask for a tour. These libraries are staffed by volunteers and they will be glad to show and explain their collections to you. Bring your pedigree charts and family group sheets to the library. Your first search should be to see what previous research, if any, on your lines has been done. The genealogical library in Salt Lake City has thousands of family histories. Many were donated by patrons. Some of these are book form and some are microfiche or microfilm copies. You may discover a great deal has already been researched and written about some

Scottish Family Histories, a 254 page hardback, is a list of printed books, pamphlets, periodical articles and manuscripts on particular Scottish families (3200 entries). WARREN COUNTY GENEALOGICAL EXHIBIT

- 1. Registration date at Extension Office. Watch paper for dates. Usually first week in July. State classes to be entered. Registration fee is \$1.50 for four entries or less; \$2.00 for more than four entries per exhibitor.
- 2. Entries are limited to Warren County residents and members of WCGS. Due to limited space, exhibitors may register one entry in each of twenty classes.
- 3. All entries should be accompanied by information to show their genealogical connection to the exhibitor. (Preferably on a 3 X 5 card)
- 4. Exhibits which have won premiums in previous years may not be entered again except as part of a display exhibit.
- 5. Diligence will be used to insure the safety of articles after their arrival and placement, but, in no case, will the management be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
- 6. Entries are to be in place no later than noon on Saturday, July ___. Entries will be accepted from 9:00 a.m. to noon only. Judging at 1:00 p.m. Saturday.
- 7. Exhibits are to be picked up from 9:00 10:30 a.m. Thursday, July ___.
 Superintendents will not be responsible for anything left after that time.
- 8. Superintendents reserve the right to reclassify exhibits if necessary.
- 9. Senior division is open to all ages. Junior division is open to those 16 & younger.

Premiums: First - \$3.00. Second - \$1.50. Third - \$1.00.
