## A Tribute to My Father

Genealogy -- a history of the descent of a person or family from an ancestor; we collect names, dates, and pictures, but too often we neglect to record the qualities of the men and women who are the ancestors.

This article is to be a tribute to my father who would have been 100 years old last November 7, Andrew J. Simmerman, son of John Harvey and Mary Jane (Stewart) Simmerman, grandson of Harvey and Margaret Simmerman and Thomas and Catherine (Cue) Stewart. His great grandparents were David and Mary Simmerman and James and Catherine Cue. He died in 1972 at the age of 84.

His life spanned perhaps one of the most interesting times in history. It began after the days of dire hardships of the pioneer, but still in a time when one had to depend upon oneself for most of the necessities of life. Perhaps growing up in such an atmosphere gave him those qualities necessary to survive the depression years and caused him to adopt a way of life characterized by working and saving for the things one needed. He was not famous -- just an ordinary hard-working, clean-living man. Was not being 'who he was' and the qualities he showed in his living -- those which showed a genuineness of character -- the greatest contribution he could give to his descendants?

He was friendly and outgoing and never moody, nor was he harsh in his dealings with others. He was respectful, and so, was respected by family and friends. He was cheerful and brought humor into our lives. We learned to do our work first and play later, and almost always there was time in the afternoon and in the evening after chores to play. There was music in our lives. Our parents saw to it that we had music lessons. Dad played the harmonica and sometimes we had jam sessions with him on it, or singing with us, and my sister at the piano. Sometimes he took requests for his harmonica, and the fact that, usually, the modern tunes requested sounded like "Turkey in the Straw," or a similar song from that era, only made it more fun.

He cared about people and things. He saw that his livestock was well cared for. He built good fences and kept his farmstead in good repair. We find breeding and planting records on the inside walls of barns and sheds, and he kept journals from which we are gleaning such information as, "January 14, 1937, 'Aleine was hurt'", and when he bought his first automobile.

When he was in the field alone, what did he think of? Things that needed to be done to make life easier (or to survive)? Did he think about what he wanted for his family? for his friends? Was this when he formulated some of the "editorials" that he wrote on scraps of paper --

some of which we have found in his papers? Surely, he wanted what was right, though it might cause him sacrifice.

He never quit learning and thinking and helping, and always held a positive outlook on life. He must have fund this little poem somewhere and it appealed to him. We found it in his 1941 journal.

Let us look in the future Look not in the past with regret; The best things in life Are to happen yet.

He gave us little sayings to guide us, e.g. this rule of thumb, "When in doubt; say NO," and this one he gave complete with demonstration! "It's not what you wear, but how you wear it that counts." He was strong and we could always depend on him to be there when we needed him -- to help us or to rejoice with us.

I guess the big thing in my childhood years was the dream of building a new house. This was a family secret (probably made so to keep the kids from blabbing it all over!) and we all planned and saved in whatever way we could to make the dream come true. The house was built in 1935. At about the same time the natural gas line was run from the main line to Indianola, and homeowners along the way could apply for hook-up, so we had the first rural home in the county to have natural gas installed. There was no electricity in our community so we had natural gas lights and cook stove. However, being first with something was unusual for our family; most families had radios long before we did, for instance.

As I remember, none of us minded that we did not nave many luxuries. We had ponies, dogs and cats and made pets of calves and lambs, and all of us agree that we had a full and happy childhood. At the same time, our parents taught us by example and instruction such things as good manners, good morals, love, honesty, self-discipline, self-reliance and other qualities they knew we needed to be happy adults.

Those men and women, sons and daughters of the hardy pioneer, who lived from the time when the horse was the "vehicle" of work and play, through the thrill of the horseless carriage, and on the sophisticated automobile and airplane, then watched with interest man's walk on the moon had a very special experience. The change was slow, gibing then a chance to absorb it, adjust to it, and enjoy it. Did living through that period of history and the changes it brought to their lives instill in them those qualities we remember about them and now consider the good things in life?

The generation growing up will see more rapid change, but one wonders if they of the 'biogenetic and computer-driven' society will feel the same depth of experience which their forbears felt watching their world change from the most simple way of living to the exploration of space. Perhaps it is for us, the 'generation between', to help the new generation understand, appreciate, and remember those members of the older hardy generation and all the knew, believed, and lived.
