#### HOUSEHOLD CENSUSES OF IOMA

- 1850 The first census to name each member of the household. Also lists age, sea, color, occupation, value of real property, literacy of those over twenty.
- 1856 Special State census. Hame, age, sex, marital status, birthelace, occupation, whether entitled to vote, whether a landowner and number of years in laws.
- 1860 Name, age, sex, occupation, color, birthplace, value of real and personal property, literacy of those over twenty.
- 1870 Name, age, sex, color, occupation, whether father and mother are foreign or native born, literacy, if male citizen over 21, value of real and personal property.
- 1880 Hame, age, sex, color, occupation, marital status, relationship of head of household to each person in the household, birthplace, birthplace of parents of each person listed. (Sounder is available for families with children ten years old and younger living in the home.)
- 1885 Special state census. Name, age, sex, occupation, address, towaship and range, state born, (if in lows, the county of birth is listed), whether parents are foreign or native born.
- 1895 Special state census. Name, age, sex, occupation, birthplace, religion, company and regiment
  if served in the military, whether entitled to vote, whether subject to serve in the
  militia, if born in lows; what county.
- 1900 Name, age, month and year born, marital status, number of years married, number of children born to wife, number of children living, birthplaces, birthplaces of parents, year of immigration to US, whether naturalized, occupation, literacy, whether rent or own property. (Sounder available for all households).
- 1905 Special State census. Name, age, sex, occupation, birthplace, if owner of a farm or home, value of property, education, marital status, number of years in love and number of years in US. This is on cards, one for each person.
- 1910 Name, age, sex, color, eccupation, relationship to head of household, year of immigration, whether naturalized, birthplace, birthplace of parents, literacy, whether owner of farm or home, if a survivor of Civil Mar service designation of Union or Confederate army or navy, number of years of present marriage, number of children born to mife, number of children living. (more)
- 1915 Special state census. Hame, age, sex, occupation, birthplace, church affiliation, parent's birthplace, marital status, number of years in US, number of years in Iowa, whether naturalized, military service, whether property owner, earnings in 1914.
- 1925 Special state cosus. Hame, age, sex, relationship to head of household, marital status, whether home or farm is rented or owned, value of real property, number of years in lows, number of years in US, birthplace, names of parents, ages of parents if living, birthplace of parents, location of parent's marriage, military service, occupation, church affiliation.

# KNOX COUNTY, OHIO CEMETERY BOOK

Vernon, Ohio 43050 (1-614-397-9169) has worked very hard to compile this cemetery book which in this editor's opinion will be a very valuable addition to any genealogical library. We met him in the courthouse where he explained to us how he had correlated all death records, cemetery records, funeral home records, etc. to come up with as accurate a compilation of the deceased as is possible. The book contains 173 cemeteries with well over 35,000 names, 740 pages of tombstone readings, 204 pages of full surname index. # FIRST SCHOOLS IN INDIANOLA, IOWA

THE INDIANOLA RECORD dated Thursday, January 28, 1926 contains as complete history of the Indianola School District as could be compiled at that time. It is the intent of the editor to provide some names of some of the earliest persons named in this issue and to tell some of the facts as stated in the paper.

M. R. BARKER (pictured p. 1) was said to have been active in the schools for more than fifty years, beginning in 1850. The first school in Indianola was in a house which M. R. Barker had built for use as a store building. This was in the winter of 1850 and the teacher was Dr. Hezekiah Fisk. Between 1850 and 1855 school was held in a frame building which occupied the site of the "present" Opera Block on the south side of the square and which served as church, court house, and post office, as well as the school house. In 1859 school was held in a building which stood where the United Presbyterian church "now stands." Teachers at this location were J. D. McCleary, Julius C. Clark, and Mrs. Julius C. Clark, and Wesley M. White, afterward county superintendent.
