Commenting on the tendency to read meaning into photographs, oral historian Paul Thompson writes in Edwardians in Photographs: "The camera may not lie, but what kind of truth does it tell? Photographs are silent, but we cannot rest with that; we invent one. Most old photographs, therefore are half pieces of history, half out of our own minds...Photographs do not convey the consciousness of the people in them —why they were doing what they were doing and what they felt about it."

Were the people as comfortable together as they looked? Did everyone actually take part in the festivity? Or was that something I saw there because I wanted to see it?

Does make us think about them, doesn't it?

USING CENSUS RECORDS

DON'T...

- ...assume the spelling of the name is as you know it now.
- ... believe the census indexes to be either correct or complete. Check the records.
- ... assume the relationship to the head of the household is as stated.
- ... assume the wife is the mother of any or all of the children listed.
- ...assume the ages given provide a year of birth.
- ... forget to copy all data from the top of the page and to the right of occupation column.
- ...forget to look over the neighbors. Look for married daughters, sisters, etc.
- ...think that the records before 1850 will not be helpful. It will give an indication of the number and ages of people in the household.



NOVELTY MILLS - Feb. 3, 1876, Page 3, Col. 4 - One and a half columns telling about "One of the Most Important Improvements of our Place During the Past Year. The Mr. Jessie Bryson, proprietor; John Kerlerman, head miller and his assistant N. C. Westerfield; efficient engineer and machinist Mr. H. C. White.

MEASLES - Feb. 10, 1876, Page 3, Col. 1 - The measles are very seriously interfering with the Scotch Ridge school and even the teacher, Alex Hastie has them and has been compelled to stop his school on that account.

LECTURE ASSOC. - Feb. 10, 1876, Page 3, Col. 1 - At its last meeting elected the following officers for the second quarter. Pres. G. A. Kern, V.P. Miss Fannie Andrew, Secretary Miss Addie Hayden, Treas. J. J. Spray, Corres. Sec. Geo. W. Lee.

FARMS- Feb. 24, 1876, Page 3, Col. 1 - Wm. Coffman has bought 20 acres of land south of Mr. Gifford's property. He paid \$2200 for it.

Joel Jacoby has sold his farm 2 miles West of town to a Mr. McCoy of Alleghany City, PA for the sum of \$13,000.
