A bit belated but here are more messages in "A Genealogist's New Year's Resolutions. Via Clarke Co. (NV) Gen. Soc., Jan, 1993, via Old Fort Gen. Soc. of Fort Madison, IA.

- 1. Commit at least two hours on a selected day each week to genealogy; by selecting the time and day in advance you are more likely to try to meet your goal - just make it realistic.
- 2. Begin to organize your genealogical material so that you can find things when you need them; buy the files and use them; once organized continue to use your system.
- 3. Select a family, state or country to concentrate your research in.
- 4. Write one genealogical letter per week. Be sure to mail the letter once it is written.
- 5. Re-read the material which you have already gathered, looking for clues you may have overlooked the last time you read the material.
- 6. If you don't know where the above material came from, start a system of documenting your sources.
- 7. Go to a genealogical library on a regular basis; select the day and time and make it part of your regular schedule.
- 8. Attend your local genealogical society meetings and get involved; groups can only function when they have mebers who become actively involved...it's not enough to just belong.
- 9. Write a query and mail it to a genealogical society. Let others know what families you are researching.
